

Saskatchewan Party Promises Kept within the First 100 Days:

- Removed PST on used cars.
- Introduced fixed election date legislation.
- Created Enterprise Saskatchewan.
- Full Coverage of the life-extending cancer drug Avastin.
- Introduced stronger balanced budget legislation.
- Created tougher penalties for drunk drivers.
- Smaller, more efficient cabinet.
- Introduced the Growth and Financial Security Act.
- Introduced more balanced labour legislation.
- Introduced Essential Services legislation to protect the safety of SK people while balancing the rights of workers.
- Cancelled the Domtar MOU which risked \$100 Million taxpayers dollars.
- Set up the Duty to Consult round-table conference in May to ensure Saskatchewan First Nations and Métis people become true partners in Saskatchewan's economy and future.
- Signed a new partnership agreement with SUN for the recruitment and retention of nurses.
- Changed the prescription drug plan to cap prescription costs at \$15 for children under the age of 14.

Other Accomplishments in the First 100 Days:

- Saskatchewan Short-Term Hog Loan Program and the Saskatchewan Short-Term Cattle Loan Program will provide an estimated of \$90 million dollars in funding.
- Signed onto the national AgriInvest and AgriStability program.
- Working with other western provinces to create a western Canadian water resource and conservation plan, as a part of climate change adaptation.
- Investing in Knowledge with four new research projects at the University of Regina, with \$500,000 pledged through the Innovation and Science Fund.
- Introduced legislation to repeal the Potash expropriation powers.
- The Government of Saskatchewan, Government of Canada, and the City of Saskatoon invested \$2.8 million in the Prairieland 20,000 square-foot building expansion.
- Ensuring safe highways with the ‘Night Rider’ program.
- Added new drugs to the Saskatchewan Formulary, such as Arthritis Drugs for Ankylosing Spondylitis.
- Signed a new agreement with the Federal Government on Training and Skills Development.
- Acquired \$240 million in federal funding for a clean coal project
- Significantly increased coverage in the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Program.
- Funded a new Bariatric Surgery Assessment Clinic in Regina.
- First ever Chief’s Feast held at the Saskatchewan Legislature.
- Funding Saskatchewan’s communities through the Canada-Saskatchewan Municipal Fund (MRIF).
- Largest ever oil rights land sale in Saskatchewan history - \$197 million in February 2008.
- Sent a Saskatchewan delegation to the Philippines to attract and recruit nurses.
